Kidney Disease: The Silent Epidemic

- ▶ Kidney disease is the **9th leading cause of death** in America – killing more Americans yearly than either AIDS or breast cancer.
- ▶ Every day, **304 people** are diagnosed with **kidney failure** – more than half a million people nationwide.
- ▶ **Minority communities are at special risk.** Kidney disease is ravaging minority communities.
 - Of the half a million people with kidney failure, **1 in 3** of them are African Americans . . . and **1 in 8** are Hispanic.

The American Kidney Fund as a Partner of Choice

The American Kidney Fund has a long history of offering compassionate, quality support to kidney patients and is a partner of choice within the renal community.

Founded in 1971 to save the life of one person who needed help paying for dialysis, today the American Kidney Fund is the leading source of direct, treatment-related financial assistance to people in the United States who are living with chronic kidney disease.

In 2010, the American Kidney Fund distributed \$209 million in financial assistance to 1 out of every 4 dialysis patients nationwide. More than 101,000 kidney patients received our assistance, helping them to maintain health insurance coverage, pay for prescription drugs, or pay for other out-of-pocket expenses not covered by health insurance.

97 cents of every dollar the American Kidney Fund spends goes directly to programs and services.
