The American Kidney Fund (AKF) fights kidney disease and helps people live healthier lives.

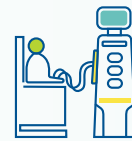

Direct financial assistance

AKF enables better health outcomes with direct, treatment-related financial support that ensures access to care, making a tangible and lasting impact in nearly 70,000 Americans’ lives each year, on average.

Health Insurance Premium Program: Provides access to lifesaving medical care for low-income dialysis and transplant patients by ensuring these individuals can maintain their health insurance coverage. Each month, AKF helps more than 130 people get off dialysis by providing financial assistance that makes transplants possible.



1 in 8 Americans on dialysis receives financial support from AKF

Safety Net Program: Provides grants to help people with health care expenses that are not covered by insurance, including transportation to dialysis, over-the-counter medicines, copays and other needs.

Disaster Relief Program: The nation’s only rapid-response program that provides emergency financial assistance to dialysis and recent transplant patients in the wake of natural disasters. Grants are used for transportation, temporary housing, kidney-friendly foods, medicines and replacing personal essentials.
