The American Kidney Fund (AKF) fights kidney disease and helps people live healthier lives.

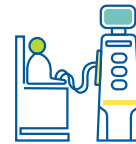

Prevention and early detection

Know Your Kidneys™: A roadmap toward better kidney health through three pathways—Know Your Kidneys, Know Your Cause and Know Your Plan. Whether looking to learn about kidney disease and prevention, discover the cause of one's kidney disease, or understand treatment options, the Know Your Kidneys initiative supports people on their journey together toward better kidney health. 96% of people with early stage kidney disease do not know they have it. Kidney disease can be detected through simple blood and urine tests.

Direct financial assistance

AKF enables better health outcomes with direct, treatment-related financial support that ensures access to care, making a tangible and lasting impact in nearly 75,000 Americans' lives each year, on average.

Health Insurance Premium Program: Provides access to lifesaving medical care for low-income dialysis and transplant patients by ensuring these individuals can maintain their health insurance coverage. Each month, AKF helps 134 people get off dialysis by providing financial assistance that makes transplants possible.

Safety Net Program: Provides grants to help people with health care expenses that are not covered by insurance, including transportation to dialysis, over-the-counter medicines, copays and other needs.

Disaster Relief Program: The nation's only rapid-response program that provides emergency financial assistance to dialysis and recent transplant patients in the wake of natural disasters. Grants are used for transportation, temporary housing, kidney-friendly foods, medicines and replacing personal essentials.

Public education and disease management resources

Kidney Action Week: A weeklong, virtual kidney disease awareness and education conference that empowers people with kidney disease and their caregivers to advocate for better health outcomes and have more effective conversations with their doctors.

Health education campaigns: AKF develops multifaceted health campaigns designed to empower people with kidney disease, their caregivers and the public to raise awareness about kidney disease, its treatments, prevention and associated conditions, ultimately driving positive change.

Kidney Health for All™: Everyone deserves to be as healthy as they can, no matter where they live, what language they speak or the color of their skin. Professional education and research

Clinical Scientist in Nephrology (CSN) Fellowship: Clinical Scientist in Nephrology (CSN): Since 1989, this highly competitive fellowship has funded the research of more than **50** early-career nephrologists dedicated to furthering advancements in the prevention and treatment of renal disorders and the quality of care provided to people living with kidney disease. Continuing education (CE/CME): Free, accredited, online CE and CME courses address critical topics related to kidney disease and are designed to meet continuing education requirements for prescribers and allied health professionals. All courses are developed and peer reviewed by renal subject matter experts.

Kidney Kitchen Pro™: A centralized digital resource for dietitians who work with people who have or are at risk for kidney disease. Dietitians can build custom toolkits and meal plans, access nutrition-related resources, share information directly with patients, and stay up to date on kidney disease research and nutrition-related news.
